Hosting datasets created by third parties

CERL has an infrastructure and the supporting interface to facilitate hosting of third-party datasets.

Service is now on available

Importance of the activity lies in the potential connections between datasets that CERL may exploit

CERL now hosts the ISTC and the Scottish Book-Trade Index (https://data.cerl.org/sbti/_search)

To preserve, improve and grow CERL's electronic resources

Shorten the time that contributing institutions have to wait to see their data added to the HPB

Support the DH community through providing convenient access to HPB data (e.g. LOD)

Work with The European Library to integrate relevant records from their National Library community

Work with VZG towards a more visual presentation of HPB data (e.g displaying images, info on maps)





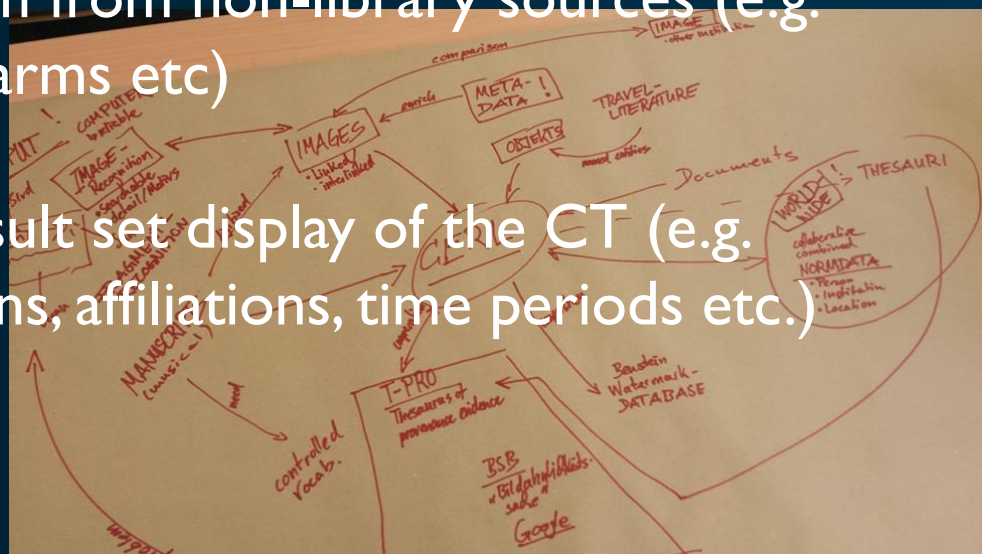
To preserve, improve and grow CERL's electronic resources

Migrate to the new CERL database hosting environment

Shorten the time that contributing institutions have to wait to see their data added to the CT

Enrich the data with information from non-library sources (e.g. biographies, portraits, coats of arms etc)

Improve search options and result set display of the CT (e.g. searching by geographical regions, affiliations, time periods etc.)



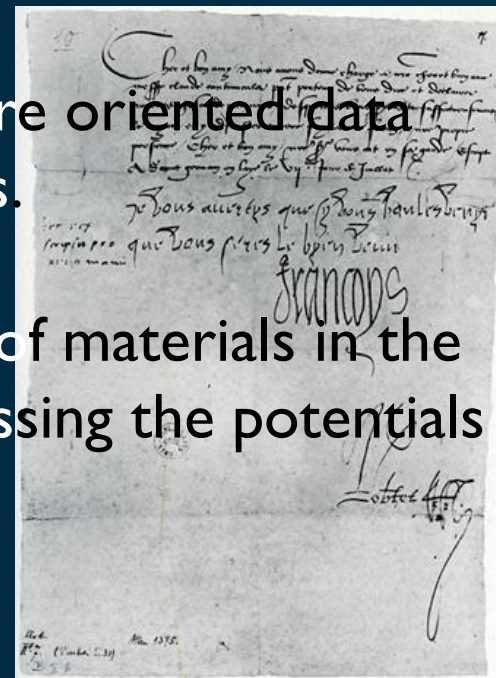


Identify possibilities for the CP, in terms of focus, development and presentation to user base (e.g. conduct an environmental scan)

Further strengthen collaboration between manuscript experts in libraries, archives and research.

Work with scholars to establish relevant and future oriented data offers, beyond pure access to databases or portals.

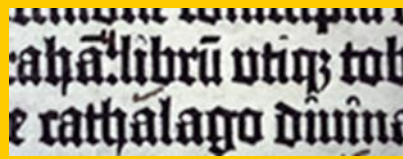
Work with scholars to enhance the presentation of materials in the CERL Portal e.g. by contextualising objects, harnessing the potentials offered by the Semantic Web.

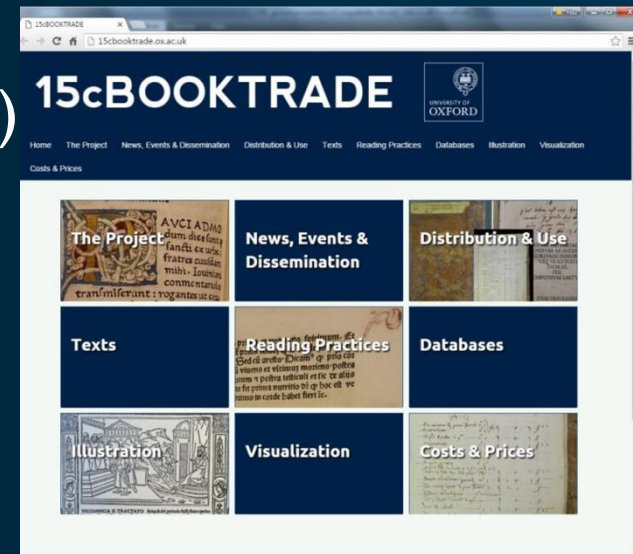


To preserve, improve and grow CERL's electronic resources

MEI developments come from the 15cBOOKTRADE project

Aim to consolidate all Incunabula-related activities: MEI Working Group becomes Incunabula Working Group

This WG will coordinate further integration of digital resources for incunabula (e.g. GW, Typenrepertorium, Glasgow incunable project)

- The Judaica community

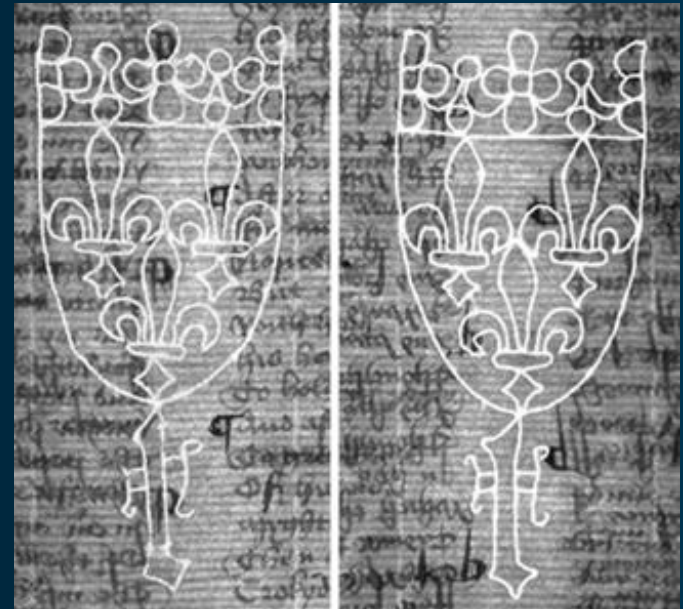


Influence stakeholders and funding bodies

Expand CERL Grants programme



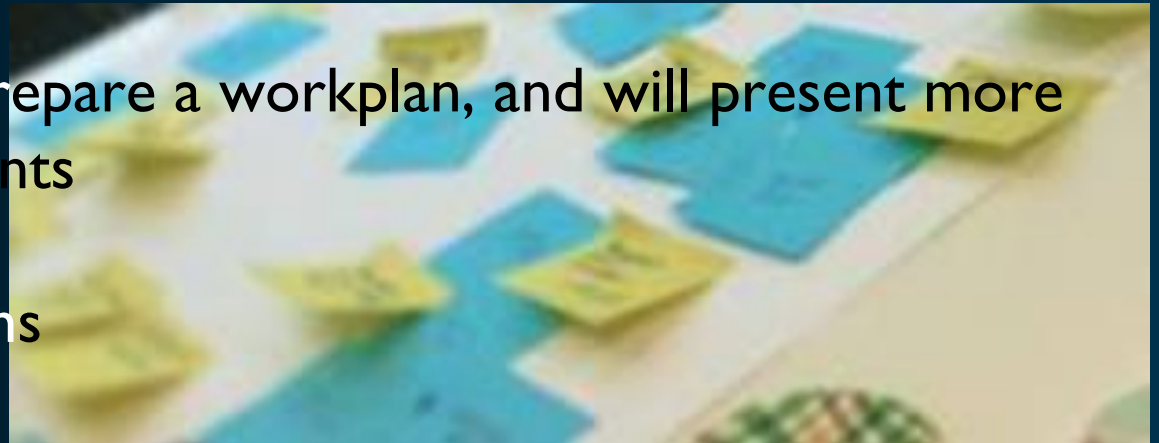
To consolidate, engage and enlarge the membership

Through the working groups (security, bookbinding, manuscript experts, provenance and promotion)

Topics include reviewing applicability of nanotechnology in securing our collections, setting up a post-theft support system, reviewing the publishing format of the CERL Newsletter, preparing an inventory of rubbings collections, and stimulating the use of the LIGATUS glossary in describing bindings

WGs will be asked to prepare a workplan, and will present more extensively at CERL events

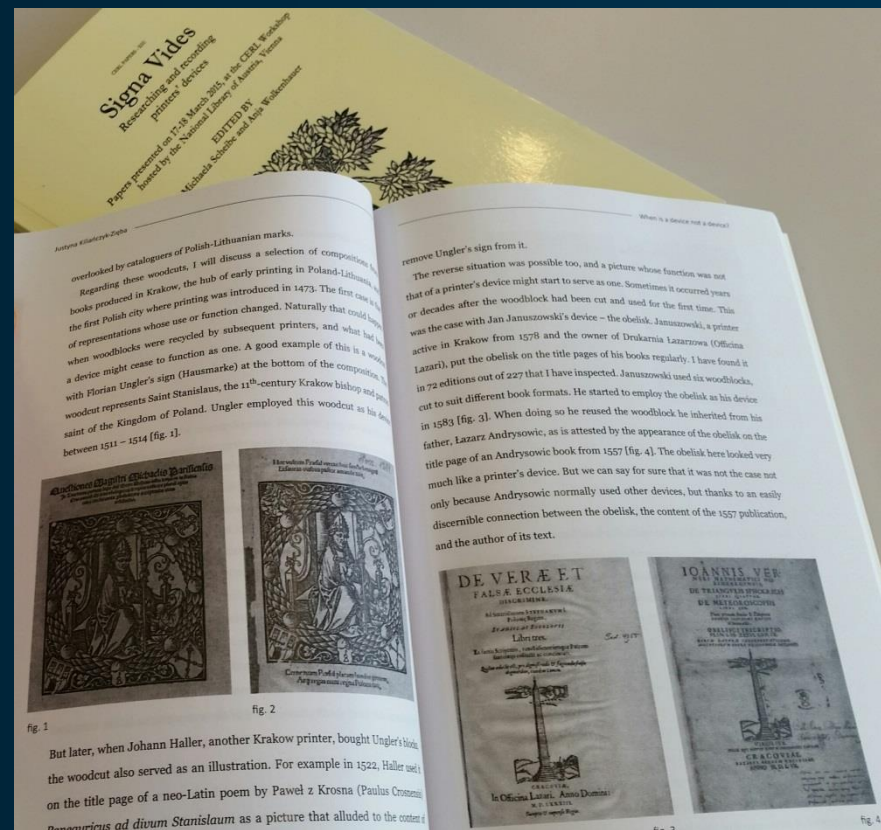
