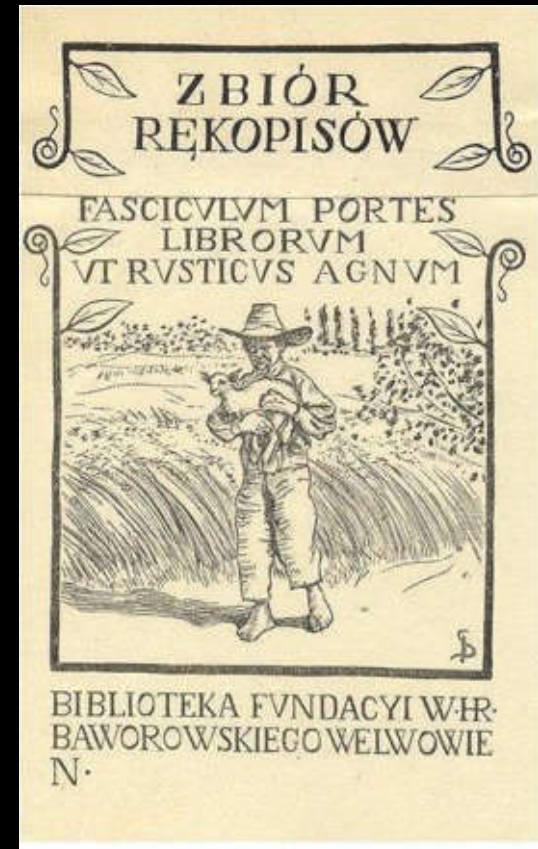

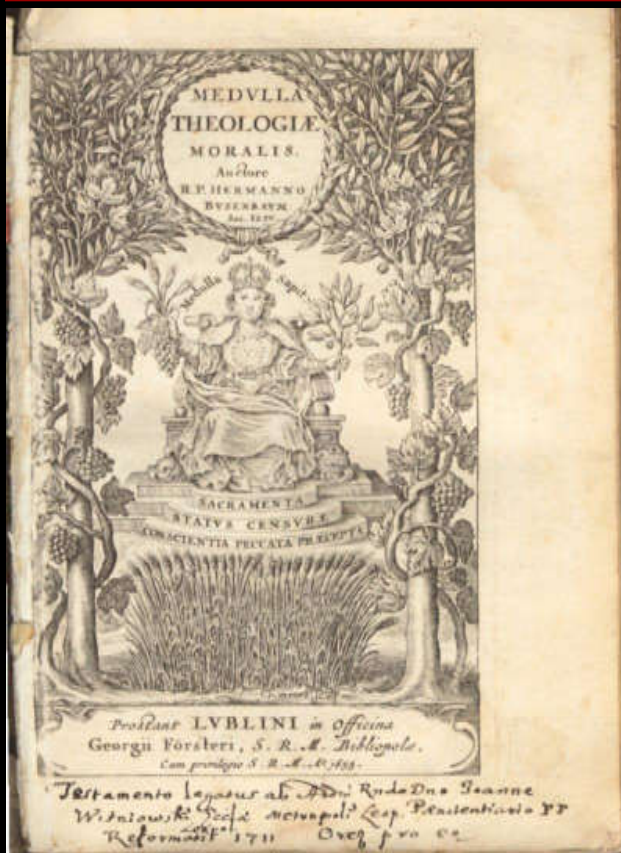
Bibliotheca Regia Monacensis, początki sięgają 1558 r., od 1919 r. Bayerische Staatsbibliothek w Monachium

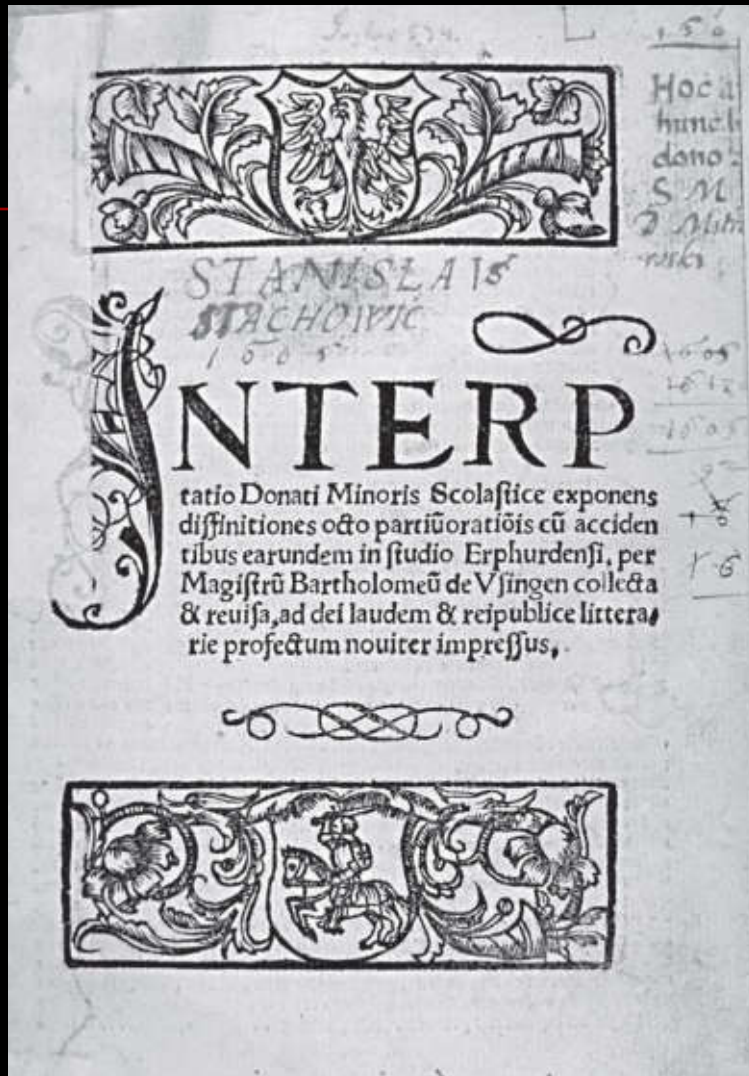

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Bodzenta Jan Chryzostom (1615–1678) *Szeliga Coat of Arms*, canon of Gniezno and Cracow, doctor of theology and law, orator, author of funeral homilies, in 1678 gave a book to Camaldolese monks in Cracow – 35

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Collegiate Church of The Immaculate Conception of the Blessed Virgin Mary and St. Michael the Archangel in Łask (*Ecclesiae Collegatae Lascensis*), founded in 1525, high remuneration of primate Jan Łaski, for example, in liturgical books, a college of assistant curates – 152

Congregatio Eremitarum Camaldulensium Montis Coronae

- Cracow – Bielany (Eremitus Montis Argentini apud Cracoviam), dedicated to the Assumption of the Virgin Mary to Heaven; founded in 1605. The Library was established owing to the funds from Jan Chryzostom Bodzanty, a canon of Cracow and Gniezno – 35
- Warsaw – Bielany (Eremitus Montis Regii) funded by King Władysław IV Vasa (Vladislaus IV Vasa) in 1641,

Cracow Academy, the oldest university in Poland; since 1364 as a Studium Generale it was divided into three faculties, and halls of residence, it had its own book collections; in the 16th century the library was extended to a new building; in the 18th century it numbered 32 thousand prints

- Bursa Germanorum – founded in 1488 by Jan of Głogów, gathered arrivals of German nationality from the Cracow Academy – 262
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Czarnecki Józef (1857–1922) Prus III Coat of Arms, son of Zygmunt Czarnecki, in 1914 sold (also bequeathed) his father's collections to the Library of Count Wiktor Baworowski Foundation – 218

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Eck (Ecchius) Valentin (ca 1494–ca 1556) German humanist, poet, erudite, writer. Published classical authors. Studied in Leipzig and at the Cracow Academy, where later he worked as a lecturer. Associated with the Cracow humanistic circles – 141

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
